An Underearner Discovers Real Recovery

Thinking this morning about the annual GSR conference that would be happening again soon in a couple of weeks brought up a few great memories I have of being a GSR and attending the WSC (World Service Conference) back in (I believe) 2007 and 2008.

My life was pretty simple back then. I was pretty broke and very underemployed; what little work I did have was mostly of the underearning variety. Still, I was determined to somehow "figure this out" so I went to a lot of meetings. After all that's what I did in AA and somehow, I managed to stay sober for almost ten years despite doing very little work in that program. (And by work, I mean step work - the kind that reveals who I am, what's eating me and gives me a chance to get past what this person or that person did to me. That I wasn't interested in. Actually, I was interested in it but the thought of really getting honest was too scary for me along with a lot of fear. I was very ashamed of well...pretty much everything.)

I did though learn that by doing service I could make friends and even impress some people with what "a good program" I worked. I was really good at keeping people at an arm's length (at least) away and continuing what my ex-girlfriend referred to as my song and dance - "just ask him a question and

watch him and watch him sing and dance." I was not only a world champion liar but also an underearner with very little self-esteem. My lying while frequently amusing did very little other than keep me what I then thought was safe. (If I was incapable of doing anything than no one would have any expectations of me. Therefore, I could continue to fly under the radar and really not mess up anything too badly. The fear of getting in trouble or made fun of was way deep in me.)



Anyhow I showed up in DA the same way - with my people pleasing intact. There was a regular Sunday night meeting I attended filled with artists, actors, writers and really some of the nicest outcasts ever. I loved it. Amongst them was a particular woman I was pretty crazy about but very scared to approach in any kind of an honest manner. The fear of rejection walked hand-in-hand with my less than zero self-esteem. I didn't know what to do. I asked some people, my sponsor included, and he suggested being honest which I felt was pretty extreme and completely out of the question.

Then opportunity struck. The group's GSR had to have some surgery, so they'd be unable to attend the conference and they needed a replacement. Seeing this as my golden opportunity to show everyone what a great guy I was (especially the girl) I volunteered. Everyone was shocked and really happy (probably because it meant that they wouldn't have to go). What a great guy I am and what a great idea to impress everyone with. Some people wanted to know if I could take the 4 or 5 days off from work. I said it wouldn't be a problem. I honestly couldn't remember the last time I actually had work 4 or 5 days IN A ROW.

The official GSR told me they'd mentor me regarding what to do when I got to the conference which was just a few weeks away. They were a bit of an underearner themselves and their advice to me was "Don't get stuck on any committees." I liked this plan a lot which was starting to look like a free vacation - something I could really use.

When I got to Dallas for the conference, I was looking forward to meeting new people, taking lots of notes to report back to my group and spending a lot of time by the pool. The first day was great - and by great, I mean breakfast, lunch, some meetings, and lots of people to joke around with.





Then something terrible happened. It was time to go to work - different groups (literature committee, resource development committee) were meeting in different conference rooms to discuss and plan the next year's business for DA. I kept thinking what my mentor told me, "Don't get on any committees" which was starting to sound only about half good to me cause I kept thinking about the swank room I was getting to stay in and all the free food. It started occurring to me that my group,

my friends had all contributed a bunch of money to send me here and the thought of just lounging by the pool was not sitting all that well with me. Somebody asked me if I was doing anything and would I mind helping by delivering boxes of supplies (pens, clip boards, etc.) to the different conference rooms? Sure, I could do that which I did.

As soon as I dropped off the last box in the last office, a terrible thing happened. Someone shut the door and the meeting was about to begin. Oh no! I thought I'm trapped. I was too embarrassed to just walk out so I figured I'd hang, listen, and take some more notes for my report (which I was really hoping to crack everybody up with). The acting secretary announced that we were gonna have elections to delegate the different positions needed to get the group up and running. "Don't join any committees" that was my mantra, and I was sticking to it.


Then something odd happened. No one was volunteering for anything. it was getting tense inside of me. Someone suggested we pray and then meditate for a few minutes. Okay we all said - sounds good. While we were meditating another little voice showed up in my head and this one said, "Really? You're not gonna do ANYTHING? Just sit around by the pool and take advantage of yet another situation?" I'd been doing that my whole life. If no was an option, then no was what I was gonna pick. I was getting scared.



When we were done meditating the chairperson asked if anyone would like to be the recording secretary. I don't know what happened, but my hand shot up and the most awful words I'd ever spoken came out of my mouth..."Sure, I could do that." Now I was really trapped. I got through the meeting, and it was ok. All the other commitments got filled. Everyone was really nice, and we got a bunch done.

Rather than feeling trapped I was feeling pretty good because I said okay to helping. I decided to go for a run. When I got back to the hotel, I ran into a few people I'd met at breakfast who asked me how I was doing. I said I felt really clean. And I did. I felt really clean because for once in my life I really felt like I had shown up not just for myself but for some other people too - for DA.

The rest of the conference was great. I got to do a bunch of work and service. Even though much of it was exhausting I felt really good about myself and knew that when I returned to LA I could really show up at my group, give my report and know that I had really done the job I was sent to do. I could tell the truth and not just go into that old song and dance just to make everyone like me. I liked me.

After the relationship ended, the practical pairs saw heavier rotation.


My underwear was under being.




